Australia and the world are set to unite and celebrate the biggest global sporting event of the year, at the **FIFA Women's World Cup 2023™**, to be staged across Australia and New Zealand for the first time ever.

With exclusive free-to-air broadcast rights, the Seven Network will take the nation on an exhilarating ride through the blockbuster tournament; with Australia's mighty Matildas at the heart of the action, as they go in search of game time glory and their maiden Cup title.

From the spectacular opening ceremony on July 20, through to the Cup final on August 20, **7SPORT**'s Mel McLaughlin and Bruce McAvaney will lead an elite commentary team delivering 15 key matches – including the first round clash between Australia and Ireland, major Quarterfinals, both Semi-Finals and the decider – all to be broadcast live, free and in HD on Channel 7 and 7plus.

Mel McLaughlin is an experienced and popular sports presenter and commentator, who has covered a host of major international sporting events for the Seven Network.

She began her almost 20-year media career in Sydney, as a radio reporter and presenter, before moving to Sky News, Fox Sports and Network 10, while always wearing her love for football on her sleeve.

This passion is evident in her body of work covering the code, marked by her insightful commentary, knowledgeable interviews and a genuine warmth and likeability that connects her with every football fan.

Since joining Seven in 2016, Mel has hosted the network's coverage of the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio, 2018 Winter Olympics in PyeongChang, 2018 Commonwealth Games in Gold Coast, 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo, 2022 Olympic Winter Games in Beijing, and 2022 Commonwealth Games in Birmingham.

Her FIFA credits are just as impressive, covering the Socceroos World Cup qualifier in 2005 (for the FIFA World Cup in Germany 2006); as well as hosting FIFA World Cups in South Africa in 2010 and Brazil in 2014. Mel also fronted every night of the Confederations Cup in Russia in 2018 and France 2019.

She is a FIFA Women's World Cup 2023™ 'Beyond Greatness' champion and was invited to host FIFA's World Cup Draw, in Auckland/Tāmaki Makaurau in October, recognition of her standing in the international football community.

Mel will anchor Seven's coverage across the tournament, as well as present the **Highlights** program, to air 2.00pm (check local listings) daily on Channel 7 and 7 plus.

Known around the world as 'the master sportscaster,'
Bruce lends his extraordinary talents and gravitas to the **FIFA Women's World Cup 2023™** – the first football tournament he has covered in his remarkable 47-year career.

But make no mistake, his vast sporting knowledge and methodical preparation for any assignment is without peer and has been his trademark since beginning in media as a horse racing caller for an Adelaide radio station, back in 1976.

He would go on to cover 10 summer Olympic Games, six Commonwealth Games, 20 AFL grand finals, and a host of other elite international sporting events. Last month, his brilliant career calling AFL was recognised by the code, when he was inducted into the Australian Football Hall of Fame.

It follows similar honours last year, when he was awarded the Melbourne Press Club's Lifetime Achievement Award; The Kennedy Foundation prize for his outstanding contribution to sports broadcasting and induction into the *TV Week* Logie Awards Hall of Fame.

This followed his induction into the Sport Australia Hall of Fame in 2002, and a Medal of the Order of Australia that same year.

Joining Mel McLaughlin as host, Bruce will be the voice of all the Matildas matches licensed to Channel 7 and 7 plus.

#### **MESSAGE FROM BRUCE**

The FIFA Women's World Cup 2023™ is one of the greatest events we will see in this part of the globe. Football is a shared culture, an international language and it's a privilege to host the beautiful game in our own multicultural backyard.

We know there will be joy and heartbreak and we'll experience together all the agonising suspense and outpouring of relief that accompanies all sport, and particularly this sport, at the highest level.

At every level, I think we're well prepared for battle. It's taken careful and sometimes ruthless planning to get the Matildas to kickoff. We've seen our team mature and we're invested in them. Some of our players have been on this journey for a decade or more; it's been a long buildup. They've lent their talents to overseas competition and come back stronger and with greater international experience. They're a cohesive unit, in no small part thanks to Coach Tony Gustavsson. He's ridden the rollercoaster with each player and has grown the momentum.

The Sydney pitch at Olympic Park resonates with many of the team members. Here, in 2000, Cathy Freeman dominated on the world stage and remains the Matildas' role model. They'll be harnessing her determination and looking for the same whole-hearted support that spurred her to victory.

For the first time, 32 teams will be competing, including the four previous World Cup winners. The United States remains perennial favourites and, in our own group, Canada is the greatest threat. The wave we'll have to push through comes from Europe – two-time winner Germany, Spain, France and the Lionesses of England.

We know there will be surprises – it's the nature of the game. We've all seen what it means to win a World Cup. In Australia we hope against hope that we get to experience that joy. It's been a long time coming.




